State funding will help raze hospital site

The **Butler County Port Authority's** second try at winning a grant from the Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund bore fruit Tuesday.

The fund awarded the port authority \$1.8 million to demolish the **Middletown Regional Hospital** buildings, and remediate the property, including removal of asbestos and contaminated soil, according to a news release.

The port authority had missed out on \$41 million in Clean Ohio grants that were awarded in July by the agency, which is part of the Ohio Department of Development. The authority, which had originally asked for \$3 million to help cover the \$8 million project, lobbied for the \$1.8 million in unspent funds.

Middletown Regional Hospital is moving to its new facility, Atrium Medical Center, by the end of the year. The city plans to develop condominiums on the site.
